The focus of this chapter is on wisdom, folly, righteousness, and the practical consequences of our choices.

Key Verse: Proverbs 14:12

Introduction:

Proverbs 14 offers guidance for living wisely, showing the contrast between wisdom and foolishness, righteousness and wickedness.

Main Points:

1. The Builder vs. the Destroyer - Proverbs 14:1

- Application:

- Wisdom builds up lives, relationships, and communities.

- We are called for a renewed commitment to live in Godly fear.

- The house of the wicked will fail, but the tent of the upright will flourish.

Impact of Leadership (14:34)

- Righteousness elevates a nation; sin is a reproach to any people.
